

Corrigenda and Errata

Our goal is to make *Chebacco* as accurate a source of historical information as possible. Accordingly, we wish to correct any errors we discover or that are brought to our attention and we welcome all comments from our readers.

In *Chebacco* XII (2011)—

"The Histories of Saint Sauveur" contains the following errors:

On p. 23, the site of the first French settlement is incorrectly identified as "St. Croix, Canada." In fact, St. Croix Island, where the French first settled, is located in Maine, to the west of the Saint Croix River channel, the international border with Canada. The island is part of the Saint Croix Island International Historic Site, a unit of the U.S. National Park Service.

Also on p. 23, the second French settlement was located at *Port* Royal, not Fort Royal, as the article states. At Port Royal, the French erected the "Habitation," located near Annapolis Royal, of which a reconstruction exists today.

On p. 31, the name of David Hackett Fischer was misspelled.

"John Gilley Fell at the Battle of the Wilderness" contains the following error:

In note 82 on p. 88, the name of General John L. Hodsdon was misspelled.
